

AVID 2: Sophomore Year

Course Philosophy

AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is an elective course that prepares students for entrance into four-year colleges. There will be an emphasis on writing, preparation for college entrance and placement exams, study skills and test taking, note-taking and research. There will be weekly tutorials to support you in your high school course work.

Course Objectives

1. Students will take courses that meet four-year college entrance requirements.
2. Students will participate in tutorials for academic courses.
3. Students will learn and apply AVID skills, including note-taking, organization, time management and goal setting.
4. Students will improve their oral communication skills through a variety of activities, including presentations and Socratic Seminar.
5. Students will participate in writing to learn activities, including note-taking, learning logs and essay writing.
6. Students will learn to evaluate their own and other's writing, using rubrics and scoring guides.
7. Students will prepare for college entrance examinations, including the SAT and ACT.
8. **Students will compile and maintain a portfolio of their work. This will be a year long project.**

Daily Expectations

1. You will bring your binder to class (and school) EVERYDAY. If you do not have your binder with you or leave it in the classroom you will have points deducted from your next binder check.
2. On tutorial days you will come into class with your tutorial request form (TRF) complete with question.
3. You will be respectful to your fellow classmates, the faculty and staff.
4. **You need to monitor your grades by checking them periodically on the online gradebook.**
5. You will participate in all lessons and activities conducted in class.
