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

How to Request a Bus Stop Change

- 1. Contact your student's school and Request an Initial/Change Bus Stop Request
- 2. After verifying the information on the form, the school will approve or deny the request based upon School Board policy. If the request falls within the parameters of the School Board policies, it will then be forwarded to the transportation routing department.
- 3. The routing department reviews request to ensure it meets district, state, federal guidelines.
- 4. The school is notified if the request has been approved or denied via email.
- 5. The school will notify the parents of the outcome.

Two-mile Limit



School Board Policy 7.02, Student Transportation: All students living within the District or who are assigned to a school in accordance with cooperative agreements and who live two (2) miles or more from their assigned schools are eligible for transportation to and from school.

Students who live within the 2 Mile limit from home to school are not provided transportation services as per Florida Rule 6A-3.001 (3). A reasonable walking distance for any student who is not otherwise eligible for transportation pursuant to Section 236.083, Florida Statutes, is any distance not more than two (2) miles between the home and school or one and one-half (1 & 1/2) miles between the home and assigned bus stop. Such distance shall be measured from the closest pedestrian entry point of the property where the student resides to the closest pedestrian entry point of the property meets the public right-of-way. The district shall determine the shortest pedestrian route whether or not it is accessible to motor vehicle traffic.

Senior Corner

Class of 2023! We are so excited to celebrate you and all of your accomplishments. A few things to remember:

- 1. Are you on track? It is imperative that you know exactly where you are for graduation. If you are unsure, please email your counselor sooner rather than later! Counselors will take time to meet with every senior student to review graduation requirements and send a letter home to inform parents by the end of August. Some things to consider for graduation are below.
 - Have you passed (D or higher) all of your core credits?
 - Do you have an online credit?
 - Have you passed or received a concordant score for Algebra 1 and ELA 10?
 - Have you taken the EOC's for Geometry, Biology, and US History?
 - Do you have an overall GPA of 2.0?
- 2. Senior year goes by quickly! DO NOT FAIL any core classes or you will be missing credit. If you fail 2nd semester of English 4, you will not have time to make it up before graduation!
- 3. Check your Google Classroom. We will have news and updates on your Senior page so get in the habit of checking it. We also post a lot of scholarships!!
- 4. Fees and Fines. All students must have a zero balance to walk for graduation. Check with Mr. Demming in the Media Center to return or pay for missing items.
- 5. <u>Click here</u> to schedule your Senior Portraits through Leonards. You can schedule in studio at your convenience. You will have one opportunity during the school day to complete this if you cannot make it to the studio. See the Google Classroom for your access code.

Dress Code

Shirts & Tops:

- Tops must be long enough to cover the stomach and back at all times
- Strapless, low-cut clothing, halters, thin-straps, tube-tops, and tank tops are <u>not</u> allowed
- Tops may <u>not</u> be see-through
- Shirts are not permitted to include any of the following: alcohol, drugs, tobacco, profanity, weapons, or defamatory/insulting visuals

Jeans, Shorts, Leggings, Skirts & Dresses:

- Pants with any size holes above your fingertip length where skin can be seen are not acceptable
- Skirts, dresses and shorts must be fingertip length
- Pants and shorts must be worn at the waist at all times
- Leggings may not be see-through

Other:

- No Pajamas or slippers
- No Blankets or pillows
- No Headwear (such as hoods, hats, bandanas, wraps, etc.)
- Any gang-related material is prohibited
- Shoes must be worn at all times

Students who are out of dress code will have an opportunity to change or fix the apparel/item and return to class as long as it is not a common occurrence. Students will be placed in the Den if they are unable or unwilling to change the clothing infraction item. If a student continues to disregard the dress code, the infraction will be documented in FOCUS and followed up with parent contact. It is our goal to correct the problem as quickly as possible to avoid missed instructional time. It is the **student's responsibility** to ensure that any and all clothing items are appropriate for school.

Cell Phone Policy

Students should not use their cell phone during academic class time. Cell phones should remain in the student's backpack, pocket or purse. If a student chooses to retrieve their cell phone for any reason, the following consequences will occur.

1st Offense: Warning2nd Offense: Parent Contact3rd Offense: Phone confiscated and returned at end of period4th Offense: Phone confiscated and returned at end of day5th Offense: Phone confiscated and returned to a parent ONLY

Refusal to turn in electronics to security/student services will result in student being picked up from school by parent/guardian.
